Training and Judges Instructions

Level 2

This class is a combination of rally and obedience.

The expectations of performance are those of a Novice Rally participant at the 4H level.

Rally rules used in this class:

Unlimited communication is encouraged (no point deductions)

Multiple commands are allowed (no point deductions)

Handler may move backward during recall and use hand signals to help dog find front.

Exhibitor has one re-do for recall and exercises involving stays - minus 20 points.

Re-do on recall is allowed when dog is immediately up and following handler.

Handler can reposition dog who breaks stay.

Handler is encouraged to repeat stay command through out the sit and down stays.

The general rule is do not touch your dog, it applies in agility, obedience and rally. Excessive touching will be explained fully at walk-through.
