#### **Project Requirements**

- 1. Wool fleece is to be placed in an open, clear plastic bag. Llama, angora and mohair exhibited loose in an open clear plastic bag. No Red Plastic twine
- 2. All fleece/wool must be from exhibitors own animal.
- 3. Full fleece must be shown to receive maximum credit. DO NOT include neck, head, stomach, leg or backend wool.
- 4. Llama and Alpaca barrel fleece only.
- 5. Fleece must be dry to avoid felting. Fleeces must be skirted.
- 6. List all resources used for any information. This includes books, magazines, web sites, newsletters, etc.
- 7. Exhibitors must display small, lightweight projects in a way that keeps them secure and not able to be blown away.
