Judging Drop Off: Exhibits must be dropped off on Friday, July 17 from 4-8 p.m. for judging. No live interviews. Pick up on Saturday, July 24 from 10-11 p.m. or Sunday, July 25 from 8-9 a.m. Projects with awards displayed in Still Barn during fair.

Project Requirements

1. All clothing must be cleaned and pressed.
2. May exhibit one project in each division.
3. It is recommended that sewers should not wear their garments prior to exhibit.

SUGGESTED SEWING PROJECTS

**Youth learn one new skill a year:

Beginner - any age first year sewer; elastic waists, buttons, hooks and eyes, snaps.

Intermediate - any age 2nd or 3rd year sewer; zippers, buttons and buttonholes.

Advanced - any age 4 years or more experience sewing; matching plaids, stripes, nap or lining.

Examples of sewn clothing exhibits can include apron, skirt (cotton blend or synthetic), blouse or skirt, shorts or slacks with elastic waist, fitted slacks with zipper, sleeveless dress, jumper, dress with sleeves, two piece dress, jacket, jumpsuit or bib overall, pajamas, nightgown, housecoat, beachwear, leisure wear, formal or party wear, outerwear.

DIVISION 5001 – WEARABLE ARTICLE, OUTFIT OR ENSEMBLE

Class 01 - Beginner

DIVISION 5002 – NON-WEARABLE

Such as quilts, pillows, latch hook, embroidery, crewel, candlewick, wall hangings. Quilts can be a miniature quilt, quilted picture or pillow, baby quilt, patchwork quilt.
