Guidelines and procedures

1. Complete the H.H. project book (available at extension office) due July's leaders meeting you will need to purchase or borrow the Horse Science Book and the Horse and Horsemanship Book. All the answers will be found in there. Put H.H. book in a 3 ring binder- coloring and extras are encouraged (pictures of you horse adventure). You are welcome to add pages if needed.
2. Complete Horse Project Record Book due May 1
3. Sell \$50 in trophy sponsors or ads
4. Fill out horse ID
5. Participate in at least 1 clinic and record experience in book
6. Attend 6 4-H meetings and log them in your book
7. Make a Showmanship pattern due with H.H. book
