Exhibitor has one re-do for recall and exercises involving stays - minus 20 points

Re-do on recall is allowed when dog is immediately up and following handler.

Handler is encouraged to repeat stay command through out the sit and down stays.

The general rule is do not touch your dog, it applies in agility, obedience and rally. Excessive touching will be explained fully at walk-through.

The purpose of putting grooming first is to give the youth and dog a chance to get themselves together and then start the heeling in a more relaxed frame of mind. While this is not standard behavior at an obedience trial, at matches there is often conversation between exhibitor and the person who is evaluating (calling the commands and looking for good and bad parts of the run) before heeling begins.

The grooming exam should be done while the dog is either standing or sitting. Youth should be able to show teeth to judge, lift ear flaps if necessary and lift a paw to show nails. From showmanship, the dog should be comfortable with being touched by youth, having paws moved or lifted while there is an adult close to it.

During the sit for exam exercise all the judge does is walk up touch the dog's head and walk away.
