Through our pledge of "hands to larger service," 4-H has historically given back to the community by encouraging young people and adults to volunteer. In 4-H, service is commonly defined as the voluntary action of an individual or a group of individuals without pay. Service to the community – through food drives, raking the yard of an elderly neighbor, adopt-a-highway programs, teens teaching younger youth, teens mentoring children, or youth determining community needs and helping solve community problems – helps young people learn caring, leadership and citizenship.

Example – Year List your most meaningful participation in school, church and community organizations

4-H Photo Page

Pages should be 8 ½ by 11 inch page, one sided

Points to remember when working on your photo page.

- *Choose no fewer than 4 or 5 photos. There is no maximum number but use common sense. Do not use a collage of photos – it's just not professional.*
- *The photos you choose should represent your entire tenure with in 4-H project work. Choose a few from your younger years, and a few that are recent. Just be sure that the photos relate directly to the project area that you are applying to receive recognition.*
- *Photos should be clear, color is best if possible. Trim photos when appropriate.*
- *Label photos*
- *Photos should be of your 4-H work/activities. Your photo page should portray your accomplishments and growth through 4-H.*
