- All books must be signed by exhibitor, a parent and leader.
- Books which contain obvious adult contribution or anything inappropriate will not be scored.
- Creativity, effort, correctness, and completeness will all be used in scoring of the book. Coloring and decorating is encouraged!
- Project books will be judged and the top 10 scores from each age group will receive placing ribbons.
- You are encouraged to answer or complete other age group questions. You are also highly encouraged to add other information such as but not limited to... pictures of housing, diagrams, information on your specific breed/variety, anything poultry related. Bonus points will be awarded.
