- 10. This project record book must be completed and turned in on May 1st.






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
Tail Talk

orses are mostly body language communicators, and while plenty of attention is given to the head, let's not ignore the other end. Here's a cheat-sheet about what the tail might be telling you.



RELAXED


While certain breeds may carry their tails higher or lower than others, this is a typical, relaxed tail.



Also called flicking, this stern movement means the horse is irritated. If it becomes a stern movement, the horse is getting cross.


Tail Talk Continued

CLAMPED
Watch out for this one. A clamped tail means the horse is tense.
This is saying, "I'm about to kick or bolt. Possibly both."



RAISED

This can mean many things.
Alertness. Feeling spirited. All of these are symptoms of a raised tail. But mostly, it just means your horse hears the "call of nature."



A 1400 pound horse will create around 8 tons of manure a year. To put that in perspective, if you were to lay that out over an area the size of 12 football fields, your hands would be absolutely disgusting.



Tail Talk True or False
After you have read the information on the page marked Tail Talk, see if you can find the True or False answer to these questions.
A raised tail could mean many things. Alertness, feeling spirited or maybe taking a "Poddy Break".
A relaxed tail generally shows no tension and hangs in a typical relaxed manner.
A clamped tail means your horse is relaxed and enjoying itself.
A 1400 pound horse will create around 8 tons of manure a year. To put that into perspective, if you were to lay that out over an area, the size would be about 20 football fields. EWWW that would get your hands smelling disgusting!
A swishing tail or flicking, this stern movement means the horse is irritated. It usually means the horse is getting cross.
